A Word of Caution:

While the World Wide Web has dramatically increased the amount of information available, caution must be exercised in the use of this information.

Please note:

- (1) The accuracy, authenticity, and currency of the material obtained online must be evaluated before it is utilized as a source in a paper. Many of the materials published online are of dubious quality.
- (2) The transiency of the information online requires that one indicate the date the material was accessed.
- (3) Do not use to electronic correspondence such as email, discussions on bulletin boards, or discussion groups as sources. These electronic sources are regarded as personal communication because the information is not retrievable by others.
