GENERAL ENCYCLOPEDIA

Last Name, First Name of Author of Article (if available). "Title of Article." *Title of Encyclopedia*, Date.

ELECTRONIC SOURCES

NOTE: If you cannot find certain information, cite as much as you can, **but a source may be considered unreliable or invalid if too much information is missing**. Include the date the source was accessed *after* the URL **if there is no copyright or publication date**.

ARTICLE FROM WEBSITE

Author's (or Editor's) Last name, First name. "Title of Page." *Title of Website*, Publisher *if different from title of website*, Date published or updated, URL (**remove http:// or https://**).

ENTIRE WEBSITE

Author's (or Editor's) Last name, First name. *Title of Website*. Publisher *if different from title of website*, Date published or updated, URL (**remove http:// or https://**).

ONLINE DATABASE SOURCE

Databases usually provide a citation to copy and paste onto your Works Cited page. **Remember to double space, indent every line after the first line, and close the citation with a period.**

DIGITAL IMAGE

Creator's Last name, First name. "Title of Image or Description." *Title of Website*, Publisher *if different from title of website*, Date published, URL (**remove http:// or https://**).

ONLINE VIDEO

Uploader's Last name, First name (or Username). "Title of Video." *Title of Website*, Publisher *if different from title of website*, Date published, URL (**remove http:// or https://**).

BIBLE

Title of Bible. Publisher, Date Published.

Works Cited Page Checklist

- Double space throughout.
- Entries are in alphabetical order by **first word of the entry**.
- Do not number entries.**
- If no author is listed, start entry with title.
*****Ignore *the, a, an* at the start of a title when alphabetizing.**
- First line of entry is aligned with the left margin.
- All subsequent lines are indented 1/2" or 5 spaces.
- Subsequent books by the same author begin with 3 hyphens and a period to indicate a book by the same author.
- One-inch margins
